TIDEWATER TIPS FOR THOUGHT

Last month we talked about fertilizing your lawn. This month I would like to touch on mowing. I know with the warm year we have had, that everyone is well underway mowing. This is a topic we could have touched on two months ago with the warm weather! However, I would just like to give you some advice and ideas when mowing your lawn.

One of the most important things is to keep your mower blades sharp. A dull blade tears the grass and will weaken your lawn giving it a whitish cast appearance. You can check this by looking at you grass after you mow. If the tops of the grass are cut straight across, then your mower blade is fine. When the ends of the grass start to look ragged or fuzzy it is time to re-sharpen. Be sure to mow around the perimeter first. This will allow you to get as close to your sidewalk, house or obstacles around the home, which eliminates a lot of trimming. Be sure to mow your lawn in a different direction each week. Doing this will keep your lawn from laying down and allow it to stand up and have a more even cut.

Privately Owned Weapons Registration

Registration of POWs is a new process to JBSA and is now mandatory when stored on the installation. This includes weapons stored in family/privatized housing and the armory. Mandatory registration also applies to persons who do not reside but store their POWs on the installation. At a minimum, registration will consist of the name of the person and contact information; record of firearm manufacturer, model, serial number and caliber/gauge; and location where the weapon will be stored.

Use AF Form 1314, Firearms Registration, to register your POW. The AF Form 1314 may be used to register up to five weapons per individual. Use additional AF Form 1314s as needed.

Unit Commanders will ensure each person registering a POW signs a DD Form 2760, Qualification to Possess Firearms or Ammunition, acknowledging they do not have a qualifying conviction under the Lautenberg Amendment to the 1968 Gun Control Act, IAW DoDI 6400.6, Title 18 USC 922, and AFI 40-301, Family Advocacy.

Top 11 Safety Suggestions for Extension Cord Use

The use of extension cords is common, but they do pose some hazards. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission recommends the following:

1) Use extension cords only when necessary and on a temporary basis.

2) Use polarized extension cords with polarized appliances.

3) Replace cracked or worn extension cords with new ones.

4) With cords lacking safety closures, cover unused outlets with electrical tape or plastic caps.

5) Insert plugs fully so that no part of the prongs is exposed when the extension cord is in use.

6) When disconnecting cords, pull the plug rather than the cord.

7) Check the plug and the body of the extension cord while it's in use. Noticeable warming of these plastic parts is expected when cords are being used at their maximum rating. However, if the cord feels hot or if the plastic is soft, the plug wires or connections are failing. Discard and replace.

8) Never use an extension cord while it is coiled or looped. Never cover any part of it with newspapers, clothing, rugs or other objects. Never place an extension cord where it could be damaged by heavy furniture or foot traffic.

9) Don't use staples or nails to attach extension cords to a baseboard or other surface. This could damage the cord and present a shock or fire hazard.

10) Use special, heavy duty extension cords for high-wattage appliances such as air conditioners, portable electric heaters and freezers.

11) When using outdoor tools and appliances, use only extension cords labeled for outdoor use.
